NCC seeks a highly motivated, compassionate Prescribing Practitioner(s) to share in our mission of providing professional mental health services to all, regardless of faith or finances. The goal of NCC Medication Management Program is to provide mental health treatment in collaboration with the people served, while at the same time, endorsing high standards of practice to reduce the risks of overdose, medication interactions, and prescription drug abuse.

Essential Responsibilities:

1. Responsible for assessing, diagnosing, and prescribing appropriate medication(s) for new patients using best practices
2. Responsible, in collaboration with the patient, for creating treatment goals and medication regimen
3. Monitors medication prescribed for efficacy, side effects, compliance, and abuse
4. Provide health education and instruction to patients as needed
5. Responsible for prescription refill orders and delegation
6. Practices collaborative care with Primary Care Provider, other medical and mental health professionals
7. Maintains accurate and up-to-date documentation as required for billing, assessment, treatment, and other activities
8. Orders labs, refers to addiction treatment, refers to other medical services as necessary
9. Assigns tasks as appropriate to medication support staff
10. Provides direct supervision to student(s) as applicable

Secondary Responsibilities:

1. Participate in agency supervision, consultation meetings, and in-house staffings for clients as necessary
2. Participates in regular staff meetings
3. Maintain requirements as dictated by certifying Board for Licensure
4. Performs other related duties as assigned

Skills and Abilities:

1. Expert knowledge in clinical decision-making
2. Actively able to support and incorporate mission and core values into daily activities
3. Commitment to social justice values
4. Excellent verbal and written communication skills
5. Demonstrated ability to work both independently and in cooperation with others
