# **Special Support**

Did you know the ranks of women who fall into the Silent Generation (born between 1924-1945) and the Baby Boomer Generation (born between 1946-1964) are swelling along with their mental health needs? These women are living longer than men and have a harder time surviving economic struggles due to a lifetime of unpaid or work-interrupting, care-giving responsibilities. In addition, labor market discrimination and inequalities built into Social Security and employer pension programs adversely impact women, leaving them worse off financially as they enter older age.
