Title: CLINICAL DIRECTOR

Classification: Full-time, 40 hours/week; Exempt

Summary: The Northwest Catholic Counseling Center seeks a highly motivated, compassionate and collaborative therapist and manager to lead counseling programs and a staff of twelve therapists. The Clinical Director (CD) serves in senior leadership and contributes to setting the organization's strategic direction and clinical priorities. The CD also establishes and supports the professional, clinical, equity, and ethical values and standards to which all clinical staff are expected to adhere. The CD promotes quality and safety of care and fosters a culture of openness, inclusion, and continuous improvement.

Duties and responsibilities include but are not limited to:

Organizational Leadership

- 1. Participate in NCC's senior leadership team, representing clinical staff in organizational and strategic planning
- 2. Preserve and implement the Center's Mission, Vision and Values with Executive Director, Member Corporation and clinical staff
- 3. Lead investigation, outreach, partnerships and transitions needed in evolving health care reform, teletherapy, and culturally responsive therapy

Assurance of Quality Clinical Care

- 1. Ensure quality clinical services and maintain professional atmosphere
- 2. Model and ensure that clinical care is trauma-informed and anti-oppressive
- 3. Oversee Quality Assurance Committee
- 4. Oversee maintenance of clinical records and HIPAA compliance

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- 5. Oversee application process for new and/or existing insurance panels
- 6. Ensure emergency clinical coverage
- 7. Oversee and coordinate client intake and referral process
- 8. Interview, select, train and supervise clinical staff and interns
- 9. Facilitate yearly performance evaluation and goal-setting process for clinician

Counseling

- 1. Maintain 8-10 hours of direct counseling per week
- 2. Adhere to professional practices for Mental Health Professionals as detailed in Center's Employee Handbook

- 11. Ability to keep accurate and appropriate records/documentation
- 12. Ability to sit, stand, bend, lift, talk, hear and perform other work with low physical requirements
